OTHER BUSINESS:

A small quantity of Chrysanthemums can be imported from overseas if a process is followed. Exporter requires a licence. The attendees were asked for their view on what should be imported, exiting cultivars or new exotic types. Question was to be discussed by the committee as to what members would like to import. Kokka group has experience exporting. Price varies. Some cultivars are patented and may not be able to be exported. Some may be virus free therefore may be more vigorous. Which cultivars from Japan can withstand our heat? Funding means to be discussed. Would an infusion of quality stock improve the lives of our members? Members reported that most of the Japanese cultivars are still strong. Can also look to the UK to import Chrysanthemums

In Australia there is a process to bring in up to 20 plants from the east after applying for a permit. This is \$60 then there is a \$20 inspection fee. Some members have done this.

Mike Hartley has a wide variety of cut flower varieties.

Voted on if this was a good idea was supported

Motion Moved Carl Slusarczyk Seconded Ian Blackwell that the membership authorised the committee to further investigate importing new cultivars from Kokka nursery in Japan and that costs up to \$1500 be approved. Vote 8 For, 0 Against, 9 Abstained.

Expect important plants be grown by members and distributed to members or sold to other states to cover the cost of importing.

What varieties do we require? Is it just to improve the vigour of existing plants? Lots of plants came via Ted King via America to Australia approximately 40 years ago The members thanked Carl Slusarczyk for his efforts investigating this activity.

Michael Drake-Brockman donation of 225 plants to Araluen to form a Chrysanthemum display

Areas north of Perth are affected by Chilli Trip. Agricultural Department would like gardeners to treatment this pest with oils however Confidor does work. It is systemic so best applied through the roots. Try IGA for David Greys Systemic Bug Killer. Active ingredient is Imidacloprid.
