Attendance 10 members and 4 apologies as per the attendance record book.

Minutes of previous general meeting held on the 12 September 2023 were available on the website and a copy was available at the meeting. Motion moved by Michael Drake-Brockman and seconded by Ian Blackwell that the minutes be accepted as a true and correct record of that meeting. Carried.

Treasurer's Report: \$8719.93 bank balance as at 31 October 2023.

12 month Term Deposit balance \$13,231.50 and this matures in April 2024.

Summary of financial activity since last meeting. Income of \$2602.46 made up of membership \$169.81, Raffle \$28, Plant Sales \$1123.80, Annual Show ACC sponsorship \$500, ACC distribution of funds \$576.85, Westpac have refunded withholding tax taken in error from the term deposit \$204.

Expenditure of \$1123.64 made up of Grower rebates \$250, Stationary \$8.36, Secretary Honorarium \$400, Affiliation fees \$125, Social Expense \$25.28, Venue Hire \$315 Profit for GCS September Plant Fair was \$528.70.

Income from Plant sales on Distribution Day was \$345.10

Annual Flower Show Planning.

New venue is Kalamunda Agricultural Hall. 48 Canning Rd, Kalamunda WA 6076

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- New date and duration is now a 2 day show on Friday 10th and Saturday 11th May 2023
- The benefits of the new venue include an entrance fee for visiting public to offset cost, can set up as we like and displays can be as we like
- Kitchen operation requires more thought to cater for Friday set up and judging and then for Saturday for the public. Would like to have at least a cup of tea, coffee and cake available. Seeking a member to manage kitchen operation and sales. Considered employing someone to run.
- Show Program changes included change of the Forrestfield Championship to the WACS Championship. Remove all reference to Forrestfield. Discussed expanding special displays as part of Section G. This would allow exhibitors to show other characteristics of Chrysanthemums.
- Show Schedule discussed how to squeeze into 2 days. See draft below. Committee to continue to refine.
- A design for the central display is required. This may possibly be on the hall stage.
- Award Presentation Function. Discuss proposed date Tuesday 21th May 2024 and venue options other than John McGrath pavilion.
- The question was asked if the show could be expanded to include any other flowers.

Systemic Bug Killer granules with active ingredient Confidor has proved to be very good. (\$17) from local hardware.

Potting mix comparison of Baileys Premium (more dense and better field capacity) and Osmocote (More chippy and required more watering)

Keep an eye out for spider mites. They like hot dry conditions. To keep at bay spray underside of leaf when watering.

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Chilli thrip are dormant in winter. Thrive in summer. Cannot see the insects as so small. Must use insecticide from New Year onwards or before buds appear.
